I am once again at that familiar crossroad in my life, obsessed with wanting to reach out to you, and thank you for the experiences I received from the Greater LA Newsletter Committee.

It was September of 1994 that four trusted servants, Bruce S., Harsant H., Lester L., and me planned and produced "The Heartbeat", your bi-monthly Greater Los Angeles Area newsletter, which presented the experiences and opinions of individual members of Narcotics Anonymous.

The purpose of our newsletter was to invite members to engage in a journey of recovery. We believe that those stories were presented in a manner that encompasses the diversity of our fellowship and are reflective of the spiritual awakening described in our Twelfth Step.

I learned how to become a graphic artist, build computers, a writer, and a reporter to further carry the message that our newsletter had powerful messages about recovery. There was so many meetings and people with clean living experiences that wanted so much to share that no addict need die from the horrors of addiction. This gave me purpose and that feeling of unity.

The last newsletter I created was the 100th issue printed in December 2019. I spent twenty-five years on the newsletter committee and created ninety-five issues on my home-built computers. I had written over two dozen stories that were approved by our committee to be placed in *the heartbeat newsletter*. It was a privilege and an honor serving The Greater Los Angeles Area and I will forever be grateful. Thanks for activating that change in my life. There is something strong inside me. I am alive inside, because I chose your way of experience, strength, and hope, instead of using some micro-waved form of recovery.

I want to thank Bruce H and the Newsletter Committee for being willing to be of service to the Greater LA Area. And to our dear NA members and newcomers, we can't force you to have that desire to be of service to the Newsletter Committee, but we know how to light that fire on the inside.


